This intensive class is for students with little or no clay working experience and will have you learning how to use the potter's wheel to turn stoneware clay into vases, bowls, and mugs. The 12-week format will help you tap into your creativity while learning and improving on the basic skills of working at the potter's wheel, glazing, and finishing your pots. From wedging to throwing to decorating with high-temperature clay, stains, slips, and glazes, this class will develop the skills needed to form and finish your very own pottery.

This fun, fastpaced class will help you tap into your creativity while learning the basic skills of clay working. From throwing to decorating with high-temperature stains, slips, and glazes, this class will help you develop the skills needed to form and finish your very own pottery.

Decoration and glazing will be explored in greater detail, while the student gains greater confidence and control in their overall pottery making. Recommended for anyone who has taken Wheel 1 two times or more, and great stepping stone on to Wheel II: How to Make Better Pots. Wheel II: How to Make Better Pots Difficulty Level: Int.-Adv. Express your creativity using the potter's wheel and learn to make better pots. This class is best suited for intermediate to advanced level wheel-throwers who have taken who have taken a minimum of two Wheel I classes and at least one Wheel 1.5 class within the last year and a half.

Handbuilding offers the beginning student a moderately paced introduction to working with clay while learning some of the basic methods for hand building, developing knowledge for pinching, slab-building, and working with slump molding. Tap into your creativity while exploring construction design and surface treatments to create a variety of table wares. Your instructor will guide you all along the way with both class presentations and demonstrations, as well as personalized attention. A great entry level class to get your hands dirty!

Top off your week in a fun, supportive studio environment with an array of projects, from functional pottery to sculptural forms, as we introduce you to a range of clay-working techniques. Learn traditional forming techniques such as pinch, coil, and slab construction. If you are more experienced, you can pursue your own independent project with guidance from the instructor. Critical dialogue with the instructor and the group, through supportive critique methods, will be encouraged.

The curriculum is designed for the true beginner, as the faculty will guide you through forming to decorating and firing of your first pots and sculptures, while learning the ins and outs of the studio. Designed for students who are truly new to clay, we recommend students take this class for a maximum of two sessions, then transition into one of our other offerings. A true beginning class, experienced students should not register.

In this self-directed class setting, work with high-fire clays, slips, and glazes while sharpening your creative thinking, problem-solving, and technical skills through one-on-one direction, instructor demonstration, and group discussion. Learn to design and throw a vase that fully considers the floral arrangement you will make in your vessel. Students will spend the first four weeks designing, creating and finishing a functional vase through hands-on demonstration and instruction. They will push their exisiting skills at the wheel along with their creative eye, as they learn new techniques, refining their ability to make what they design. The final two weeks will be devoted to learning the fundamentals of floral design from a gifted arranger. Using seasonal flora, students will be able to create their very own centerpiece from start to finish, brining their creativity and vison to life. An assignment driven class that is ideal for intermeidate to advance level students. Students must be proficient at basic wheel throwing skills. Team taugh by Artis in Residence Rachel Dubicki and arranger Schuyler Edwardsen Asbahi.

Workshops

This intermediate level workshop is for students who want to work independently producing ware for a group wood firing on Saturday May 18th. The firing, including preparation, loading, firing and post firing clean up and review, will be led by Margaret Raines Larson, who brings her atmospheric firing knowledge along with her North Carolina Stoneware heritage to Worcester through her residency. Students should make work in another class, via Open Studio (separate registration) or independently. All students must attend each session as outlined below and will participate in the day long firing by taking a shift at the kiln. Students should bring a base understanding of surface and form development for wood firing.

From trailing, sgraffito, transfers and stenciling: This workshop will give you a foundation on how to add surface flare and variation, from greenware to bisque, using colored slips and underglaze. Students should bring: 3 eachleather hard greenware, bisque ware

In this workshop you will learn the safety precautions and best practices involved in the use of a variety of third firing, decorative techniques to embellish your ware. From the application of water slide decals, to the best practices of applying overglazes and luster, in a safe environment and a creative manner. Hands on practice will generate six test works from each student, with the faculty guiding you through instruction and demonstration. Safe, effective firing will be discussed and students will help load an electric kiln in which their tests will be fired.



Stained Glass

In this 6 week class, you will learn the process of making stained glass. You will be taught the copper foil method also known as the Tiffany method. During the first class the instructor will teach you all the steps you need to know while you create a small stained glass suncatcher. The rest of the classes will be dedicated to a design choice of your own. Size and number of pieces in the design will be limited to a reasonable size that can be completed within the next 5 weeks.

Glass Artist Series Suzanne Head:

Workshop- Portrait & Pattern Difficulty Level: All LvIs Cost: \$230 Date & Time: Sat.-Sun., Jun. 8-9, 10:00am-1:00pm Instructor: Suzanne Head

Learn the basics of drawing with glass powder in this two-day workshop. In this course, students will create a human or animal portrait with a patterned background. This project includes the fundamental steps of Suzanne's process and will prepare students to move forward with their own ideas. Additional techniques such as painting line-work with enamel, creating stencils for powder, and making color samples, will also be covered. The class will end with an overview of kiln schedules and best practices for tack and full fusing. There will be an artist talk by Suzanne on Saturday, June 8th from 2:00pm to 3:00pm. Each student will need a respirator or N95 mask. All materials are included.

Suzanne Head is a multi disciplinary artist currently based in Brooklyn, NY. She has developed a technique in which colored glass powder is sifted onto sheet glass and fired in a kiln. Over multiple firings, Suzanne creates imagery that looks similar to her paintings and drawings, but is entirely made of glass. She was an Emerging Artist in Residence at Pilchuck Glass School in 2023. Her work has shown at Bullseye Projects in Portland, Oregon, the Penland Gallery in Penland, NC, and the Whatcom Museum in Bellingham, WA.

Enameling

Glass on Metal: The Art & Craft of Enameling Difficulty Level: All LvIs Cost: \$330 Date & Time: Thurs., Apr. 11- May 16, 6:00pm- 9:00pm Date & Time: Thurs., May 23- Jun. 27, 6:00pm- 9:00pm Instructor: Jennifer Carey & Peter Grigg

Enameling is an ancient process in which vitreous glass, enamel, is fused, and bonded onto metalby kiln firing. The Worcester Center for Crafts is one of the few centers teaching this craft today. The types of metals preferred for enameling are copper, steel for large-scale work, and fine gold or silver for precious jewelry. This course will cover a variety tecniques including cloisonne, wet grisaille, sgrafitto, decals, and stenciling. Basic materials are included. Students can buy materials from the studio as needed.

NEW Screen Printing with Enamels Difficulty Level: All Levels Cost: \$180 Date & Time: Sat., May 4, 10:00am- 4:00pm Instructor: Peter Grigg

Learn how to do screen printing on metal using standard 80 grit dry enamels. In this workshop, Peter Grigg will show you how to make silkscreens, fill them with photo emulsion, and expose, develop, and print enamel with them. You can read in detail about the method by going to Ganoksin.com and searching for "Screen Printing Enamels". This will lead you to an article originally published by Grigg in Glass on Metal, Vol 12, #5 October 1993, entitled "Screen Printing with Dry Enamels". Everything in that article will be covered in this workshop. In addition, he will go over the details of how to do multicolor printing: i.e., color separation, image registration, and screen control by using Adobe Photoshop or CorelDraw.



A perfect course for beginning students, as well as seasoned amateurs who would like to brush up on the basics. 35mm based single lens reflex (DSLR) cameras, as well as compact point and shoot cameras that can be manually operated are welcome. Beginning students will learn basic photographic principals such as the camera and its controls, how to use aperture and shutter speed together to gain a proper exposure, depth of field, white balance, tricky lighting situations, and how to get the right image. Later in the session student will be introduced to basic digital workflow and image cataloging from camera to computer, with an introduction to digital photography software. Students will provide their own camera and will be assigned a computer workstation accessible during class time.

It is requested all students provide a new, unused memory card for their camera before interfacing with computers in the lab.





Take the next steps with your understanding of digital photography with "Digital Photography II." In this course, you will improve your use of manual settings while learning how to "see" when looking through the viewfinder of your camera. Explore some of the many different types of photography such as portrait, landscape, still life, and abstraction, as you become more confident with your choices of composition and visual content. You will improve your digital workflow and learn basic photo editing skills using Adobe Photoshop. Print-quality images will be created as students learn the basic steps of preparing an image print, with each student producing three prints for review during the final class. Students should be familiar with the basics of photography as well as the controls and functions of their digital camera and will be assigned a computer workstation accessible during class time. Perfect for those who have taken "Intro to Photography" or want to improve their beginner skills in digital photography.



Students in this weekend-long intensive can expect to go home with at least one small (2x2" square) finished design, as well as all the knowledge and tools necessary to continue their exploration of these techniques at home, including how to make their own tools to suit their future projects. No prior metalworking experience is necessary to attend.

Raised Vessels101 Difficulty Level: Beg. Cost: \$265 Date & Time: Sat., Apr. 13, 10:00am- 4:00pm Date & Time: Sat., Jun. 8, 10:00am- 4:00pm Instructor: Michael Coffey

Raising is the process of taking a flat sheet of metal and progressively hammering it over a forming stake to create a variety of 3D shapes - typically bowls, cups, pitchers, and other vessels, but there are nearly endless creative uses for this technique! In this class we will start with the basics and create a round, symmetrical cup or bowl starting with a 6" disc of copper. No previous metalwork is required for this class.
