From wedging to throwing to decorating with high-temperature clay, stains, slips, and glazes, this class will develop the skills needed to form and finish your very own pottery.

Leveraging the resources of online and in person learning, you Leveraging the resources of online and in person learning, you will make work from the comfort of your home studio or Open Studio Sessions at the Center, as you learn about and make work for a Soda Firing. Students will learn glazing and decoration techniques for Soda Firing, along with kiln loading and firing practices. Soda Firing, a contemporary version of Salt or Atmospheric firing, yields interesting and unique effects on glazed and unglazed surfaces by introducing Soda Ash into the kiln during the later portion of the firing.

Online meetings via Zoom will feature demonstrations and lec-Unline meetings via Zoom will feature demonstrations and lectures on the clay bodies, slips and glazes that can work with this unique atmospheric firing format. Students will be encouraged to work from home, or to enroll in Open Studio, over the course of this hybrid workshop. The calendar will support time for the making and bisque firing of work, culminating with a workday in the studio glazing and loading the work into the Soda Kiln for firing the payt day. firing the next day.

Want to learn how to create your own molds without plaster? Bisque molds are a great alternative to creating organically shaped multiples. In this workshop students will learn how to construct bisque frames out of clay to create a mold for plates and how to make a mold for vessels (like a butterdish) by building solid and then hollowing out forms. These hump and slump molds, once bisque fired can be reused without the drawback of plaster chips and are a great tool to explore new forms at a quicker pace. This course is good for students at an intermediate level. Day one will be for wet work, with firmed greenware molds being completed on day two, ready for bisque firng the following week.

Students will be tasked with making color test tiles and at least 1 finished piece of jewelry. 

A perfect course for beginning students, as well as seasoned amateurs who would like to brush up on the basics. 35mm based single lens reflex (DSLR) cameras, as well as compact point and shoot cameras that can be manually operated are welcome. 

In this second class in the Ring Cycle series, the student will begin to learn how to forge non-ferrous metals using heavy gauge copper as an ingot. Skills such as proper Annealing, hammer forging, and tapering will be featured in this class as the student will be making Celtic "Ring Money", a tightly-twisted ring used as currency among a Celtic tribes in Britain during the Iron Age.

The Ring Cycle 3: Forging a Gotland Ring

In this dynamic third class in the Ring Cycle Series, the student will learn the history and the forging of a ring unique to a place and time...a silver ring known simply as the Gotland Ring, a flat-faced ring used by Norse culture from the late 9th through to the 11th century. This class will expand upon skills learned in the previous class in this series. Proper Annealing, advanced tapering, and hammer drawing will be featured heavily. At the end of the class, the student will have a good base for forging any non-ferrous metals and will leave with a Gotland Ring of their own making. théir own making.

Hammering fundamentals, forging, or attendance in the previous class is a must.



The Ring Cycle 4: Forging Wire for Ancient Rings Difficulty Level: All Lvls Cost: \$245 Date & Time: Wed., Jan. 29, 6:00pm- 9:00pm

Instructor: Louis Garcia

In this fourth and final class in The Ring Cycle series, the student will bring all of the skills learned in the previous three classes to forge wire from a small ingot of silver using only a hammer. Advanced tapering, hammer forging, and rounding will feature greatly as the student will then shape one of the rings from the first class in the series from their own forged wire. This is a class where cadence and patience comes into play as the student will have a skill that was used for millenia until the advent of the draw plate. plate.

Intermediate and advanced forging and/or the previous classes in the series are required.



Spoon Jewelry
