Ceramics

Introduction to Raku Firing Workshop Difficulty Level: Int.-Adv. Cost: \$120 Date & Time: Sun., Jul. 27, 2:00pm- 6:00pm Instructor: Clay Studio Faculty

From glazing to firing, to post fire reduction and clean up, learn the basics of raku firing! This fast fire interactive technique will put your hands on your red-hot ware as it is pulled from the kiln (with safety gloves and tongs!), reduced and quenched, resulting in unique and distinctive colors and surfaces. The workshop will start with a demonstration by the faculty, walking you through the steps of pulling ware and samples from the kiln, providing inspiration and insight. With the faculties oversight you will then glaze for and fire two to three kiln cycles of your wares. Students must provide 6 to 8 bisque fired pieces, preferably stoneware or raku clay body, not to exceed 8 in any dimension. in any dimension.

(Resulting wares will not be food safe or water tight, and should be for decorative use only. Firings will maximize the number of works by each student, but may not result in all wares being fired. Students should be prepared for exposure to heat and smoke while actively participating in the firings)



Learn to Use the Potter's Wheel Difficulty Level: Beg. Cost: \$85 Date & Time: Sun., Aug. 3, 2:00pm- 5:00pm Instructor: Clay Studio Faculty

Use the potter's wheel to throw pots, and bowls, and have fun while learning. You will be taught the basics of throwing, practice on the wheel under the instructor's guidance, and decorate your successful "first works".

Student ceramic work must be dried, fired, and glaze fired by the WCC Ceramics Staff after the workshop has ended. Once your work is ready for pick-up, you will be notified

Intermediate Soda Firing- Naked Clay

This workshop is designed for students who have Soda Fired prior and have the ability to make work independently through Open Studio. A Zoom meeting will give an overview of the timeline, discussing kiln space and surface options available, with an emphasis on little or no glaze on the exterior of forms. Students will work independently producing and glazing their wares and then meet for loading, firing, unloading and clean up, based on the schedule below. All clay bodies must be purchased from the studio.

Students will learn to cut, grind, fit, foil, and solder glass to complete a hanging sun catcher to take home with them. Pre-selected designs and materials will be waiting for you to create your masterpiece! All levels welcome, no experience necessary.

Using various shapes and sizes of colored glass, create a beautiful stained glass wind chime. All materials are included. No experience is necessary.



Healing Arts

Chen Style Tai Chi is very athletic with complex movements. It is really for the younger generation to learn, and you may find this workshop a challenge. Chen is sometimes slow but also fast. There is jumping and also stomping on the ground during some explosive movements. The movements are sometimes like the coiling of a snake. It has all the health benefits of mind/body Tai Chi is known for, offering you a happier, healthier, and a contentment in all areas of life. This workshop is 90 minutes.

Although this workshop is designed for beginners, mastering these complex movements can be challenging. A good level of physical fitness is strongly recommended to ensure a positive and successful experience.



Metals

Spend the day making Stackable Rings. Learn the basics of sizing, measuring, cutting, soldering, and forming sterling silver to create your own set of stackable rings. You'll learn to hammer textures into your rings, as well as set a small stone. Students should expect to leave this workshop with at least 3 finished rings that can be worn together on one finger. Beginners welcome!

This is a Level 1 workshop. No experience is required.


Transform flat sheets of metal into almost anything! Chasing and Repousse (pronounced reh-poo-say) is a pair of techniques used around the world and can be applied in many ways. Jewelry pieces, wall art, decorations on cups, bowls, pitchers, and more! Students in this weekend-long intensive can expect to go home with at least one small (2x2" square) finished design, as well as all the knowledge and tools necessary to continue their exploration of the

necessary to continue their exploration of these techniques at home, including how to make their own tools to suit their future projects. No prior metalworking experience is necessary to attend.



Raised Vessels 101 Difficulty Level: Beg. Cost: \$275 Date & Time: Sat., Aug. 16, 10:00am- 4:00pm Instructor: Michael Coffey

Raising is the process of taking a flat sheet of metal and progressively hammering it over a forming stake to create a variety of 3D shapes - typically bowls, cups, pitchers, and other vessels, but there are nearly endless creative uses for this technique! In this class we will start with the basics and create a round, symmetrical cup or bowl starting with a 6" disc of copper. No previous metalwork is required for this class.

The 6-week format will help you tap into vour creativity while learning and improving on the basic skills of working at the potter's wheel, glazing, and finishing your pots. From wedging to throwing to decorating with high-temperature clay, stains, slips, and glazes, this class will develop the skills needed to form and finish your very own pottery.

This self-directed class is a great opportunity for experienced wheel workers to explore their own ideas and concepts from traditional pots to altered forms, with the guidance of your instructor. Weekly demonstrations from throwing to altering to slip decoration will make up your classes, supplemented with ample one on one discussion and feedback on your work. An ideal class for any stu-dent moving beyond wheel 1.5 or any student with sound throwing skills, looking to push their ideas and abilities.



Handbuilding

Introduction to Handbuilding Pottery Difficulty Level: Beg. Cost: \$250 Date & Time: Mon., Jul. 7- Aug. 11, 6:30pm- 9:30pm Instructor: Alondra Biberos

Handbuilding offers the beginning student a moderately paced introduction to working with clay while learning some of the basic methods for hand building, developing knowledge for pinching, slab-building, and working with slump molding. Tap into your creativity while exploring construction design and surface treatments to create a variety of table wares. Your instructor will guide you all along the way with both class presentations and demonstrations, as well as personalized attention. A great entry level class to get your hands dirty!

Stained Glass

In this 6 week class, you will learn the process of making stained glass. You will be taught the copper foil method also known as the Tiffany method. During the first class the instructor will teach you all the steps you need to know while you create a small stained glass suncatcher. The rest of the classes will be dedicated to a design choice of your own. Size and number of pieces in the design will be limited to a reasonable size that can be completed within the next 5 weeks.



Photographic Storytelling Difficulty Level: Beg. Cost: \$275 Date & Time: Tu., Jul. 8- Aug. 12, 6:30pm- 9:30pm Instructor: Caterina Maina

Learn the skills to take your photography beyond the single image and create a narrative story. This course will single image and create a narrative story. This course will teach you how to start a photographic project and create meaning with your images. You will learn how to weave together different techniques to communicate your concept. Students will spend 6 weeks working on a photographic project and developing a story. We will look through photographic books to examine how photographers before us have created visual stories and learn photographic and storytelling techniques. A perfect course for seasoned photographers looking to create meaning with their images or get feedback on ongoing visual projects! Must have an understanding of how to use a digital camera, proper manual exposure, and composition. Students who have taken "Intermediate Digital Photo (now called Digital Photography II)" will be able to advance their photographic knowledge with this course. All digital cameras are welcome as long as they can shoot manually and in RAW format. Students will be assigned a computer workstation accessible during class time. It is requested all students provide a new, unused memory card for their camera before interfacing with computers in the lab.

Materials fee will support ink and paper for upto five 8.5 x 11 prints per/student.

Intro to Metals 1: Jewelery & Small Objects Difficulty Level: Beg. Cost: \$350 Date & Time: Tu., Jul. 8- Aug. 12, 6:00pm- 9:00pm Instructor: Metals Studio Faculty

Beginning students will explore the fundamentals of working with metal to make jewelry and small objects.

working with metal to make jewelry and small objects. Learn basic techniques such as sawing, piercing, filing, disc cutting, dapping, doming and finishing. This class will also introduce students to techniques such as soldering, metal forming and basic construction. Students will begin to develop skills and personal creativity through instructor-guided projects that focus on design and execution. Each student will be encouraged to complete two to three pieces while becoming more proficient with the materials, tools, studio equipment, and safety practices. This class is also great for previous entry-level students who would like additional instruction and support. additional instruction and support.
